- 44%^ of students from this cohort (2016-2017) have already graduated, and with the 8-year length of the program this year, one more student has passed the final defense and is scheduled to graduate at the end of Summer 2024 (a total of 55 % including those who have already graduated). 100 % of those who graduated are employed.
- 60%^^ of students from this cohort (2017-2018) have already graduated, and with the 8-year length of the program, students still have one year to complete the program. 100 % of those who graduated are employed.
- 30%^^^ of students from this cohort (2018-2019) have already graduated, and with the 8-year length of the program, students still have two years to complete the program. 100 % of those who graduated are employed.
- 33%^^^^ of students from this cohort (2019-2020) have already graduated, and with the 8-year length of the program, students still have three years to complete the program. 100 % of those who graduated are employed.
